CLC, *a history*

- Location: Grayslake, IL
- Population: 13,000 to 15,000 students
 - 69% Traditional-Aged, 34% Full Time
 - Diverse: socioeconomic, racial, ethnic, etc.
- Advising History
 - 2008, 5 Full-Time Advisors Hired
 - Main Focus was NSO

A more recent history, *11 years later*

- Current Model
 - Psychological Services: Crisis Intervention/Short-term Therapy (All)
 - 2 Full Time Psychologists
 - Counseling: Transfer/Career (26+ credit hours)
 - 11 Full-time, 13 Part-Time
 - Advising: NSO/FYE (0-25 credit hours)
 - 7 Full-Time, 7 Part-Time

Humble Beginnings, *Our Philosopher's Stone*

- Quiet Space in Library
- Staffed with tutors
- Free printing
- Required of Student Athletes
- Free Coffee/Tea
- Monthly Drawing

Mobile Advising

Head to Hogsmead

- Meet students where they are at!
- Set up portable table in busy areas
 - Cafe, Library Atrium, etc.
- Answer quick questions
- Set up appointments
- Promote other services, and Succeed Events
- Set up 50+ appointments in the first 2 days.
- Students were more likely to attend appointment
